#### Land Acknowledgement Statement

One aspect of the partnership is to guide panelists to see beyond the "polish" of grant writing that may be inequitably influenced by the privilege of resources (financial, educational, etc...) and, instead, focus upon the impact of the applicant.

#### **Responses as Recommendations**

"The application was unclear and did not speak to the applicant's connection to traditional arts."

Becomes

"I would recommend that the applicant clarify their connection to the traditional arts by adding language that connects their work to living cultural traditions."
