MEETING MINUTES Friday, February 28, 2025 2:30 – 4:00pm Google Meet

It shall be the duty of the Program Policy Evaluation Committee to review and assess, as necessary, ongoing programs maintained by the Council; to study new program initiatives for Council consideration; to direct the Council's ongoing planning process with respect to policies, programs, and Council operations; to make recommendations for Council action on these matters when appropriate; and to undertake such other duties as the Council may from time to time direct. The committee shall consist of no fewer than three members

The meeting was called to order at approximately 2:30 p.m. following guiding documents.

Shelley made a motion to approve the November 22, 2024 meeting minutes. Ruby seconded. All in favor and the motion passed.

Line Items Discussion

- Cathy recapped what was previously discussed in committee and full council meetings.
- Cathy reviewed line item policy options to consider that were previously discussed.
- Cathy reviewed options for deducting the amount of budget line items for operating or non-capital projects from MSAC general operating grant amounts.

Discussion

- Councilors discussed the various suggestions for line item deductions.
- An idea was presented to scale the deduction based on the amount awarded.



- Cathy will take that into consideration, and take a look at that option.
- Steven suggested the staff can work on developing materials to be presented at the May 16, 2025 PPE Committee meeting, to go in effect for the FY27 grant cycle.

New Business

- Councilors questioned what can be done to support arts organizations and independent artists in the current financial climate.
 - Steven suggested reiterating the statement being drafted with the Executive Committee and focusing on the course we're currently on.
- Councilors questioned if MSAC Staff have any concerns that would affect smaller organizations.
 - Steven mentioned general concerns for Maryland's economy that could impact the arts community.
