



With so many challenges wrapped up in 2020, one can bring light into the present moment simply by remembering. In Afro-pop soul singer-songwriter TolumiDE's latest single, she embraces the 'good ole days' with gratitude, cherishing memories to help lighten up the moment. After connecting online with mates from her secondary school days in Nigeria, she was inspired by a time with fewer cares, when she remembers "dancing in the sun." Her refreshing new release, "Throwback" celebrates "Ayo" which as a name translates to happiness, joy and wealth, with a unique emphasis on the richness of moments.

"This year, there were a lot of moments in dialogue and zoom hang outs where I really appreciated the 'good ole days' of not having any major cares or worries of the world," TolumiDE reflects. "It felt very good to have cool memories that have shaped who I am today."

Recorded in collaboration with Terry Poindexter from two separate locations, "Throwback" was produced remotely with TolumiDE recording her vocals from home. During the early days of quarantine, her acoustic album, "Mama Sunshine," resonated with her audience for its nostalgic themes; these included the beauty of brighter days, themes of love, self-assurance and overcoming challenges. Continuing an upbeat, groovy-dance feel with an R&B/ Afropop flavor, "Throwback" features lyrics in English and Yoruba, alluding to TolumiDE's Nigerian heritage.

TolumiDE music has been described as "a big blend of Afro-pop, funky reggae, neo-soul and jazz injecting her African heritage using bilingual lyrics, into a friendlier foundation of melodic pop and R&B balladry." Currently, she is a voting Grammy Member with the Recording Academy and member of Non-profit Afropolitan Youth who are the hosts of FestAfrica. Her accolades include winning the Best R&B Female Artist at the Nigerian Entertainment Awards, opening for Les Nubians at the Howard Theatre, and singing with Toby Foyeh and Africa Orchestra at the Toronto Jazz Festival. In addition, she has had the opportunity to headline shows at the Legendary Blues Alley in Washington D.C.

In spite of the success she's experienced in her music career, Nigerian-Canadian artist, TolumiDE is most inspired by her upbringing, cultural heritage and the loved ones who have supported her along the way. Through the golden moments reflected in her lyrics through which she wishes to "bring back those days..." she longs for her listeners to experience this feeling.

In TolumiDE's words, "I would love listeners to be happy, share their stories like photos and videos of cherished memories and possibly dance along to the song. Together, we can celebrate and give thanks for the simple things."

Award winning Artist and globetrotter TolumiDE takes audiences away to a tropical oasis filled with sweet soulful vocals, warm lyrics and groovy contemporary African rhythm. She's a Nigerian-Canadian soul afro-pop singer-songwriter offering bilingual albums that captivate listeners across the world.

Born in Toronto, raised in Lagos and currently in Washington DC, TolumiDE (pronounced toe–lu-mee-day) exudes great lyric finesse, eclectic style, dynamic performance energy sharing music she describes as "Suya Soul' as an artist with rhythmic dance moves and fun audience. Influenced by acts within R&B, Gospel and Classic Soul genres such as Sade, Brandy, Bebe & Cece Winans; and Africa Pop stars as, Onyeka Owenu and Angelique Kidjo, TolumiDE whose name translates as "Thank God" in Yoruba, has evolved as a Female Vocalist with audience grabbing performances, rave reviews and multiple awards. Her accolades include winning the Best R&B Female Artist at the Nigerian Entertainment Awards, opening for Les Nubians at the Howard Theatre, opening for Salif Keita, singing with Toby Foyeh and Africa Orchestra at the Toronto Jazz Festival and a wide range of international fairs as Cherry Blossom Festival, FestAfrica, MusikFest, 202 Creates and Visual Collaborative. In addition, she has had the opportunity to headline shows at the Legendary Blues Alley in DC.

Early beginnings of her music career began after TolumiDE moved to back to Canada from Nigeria after completing Secondary School studies at the age of 18. She became immersed in all forms of the creative arts while studying Fine Art at York University and singing with an all female dancehall reggae band "Women Ah Run Ting" for six years. Shortly after moving to the United States to pursue a career in graphic design, TolumiDE performances began to bubble at open mics, festivals and weddings. She quickly garnered a following for her eclectic stage presence and intimate songwriting ingenuity noted to compliment her urban soul style with a fusion of her Yorùbá heritage while exploring themes of life, love, laughter, inspiration and native languages.

Basking on press praises for her albums 'My Love' and Specialty; TolumiDE's acoustic ep 'Mama Sunshine' sheds light unto brighter days when obstacles comes our way and explores themes of love, self assurance, overcoming challenges and nostalgic memories. # Interviews





olumiDE delivers her first full length project, My Love, and simply put, it's a stunner. Exposing all the musical sides of the artist, My Love is power-packed with one great track after another. She uniquely packages inspirational messages with brilliant songwriting, flawless production and riveting vocals. Throughout the eleven tracks, all penned by the artist herself, TolumiDE bares her musical soul and takes the listener on an emotive and telling journey of her life and her Lord.

"My Love", the album's title song and lead single, is definitely one of the album's tightest tracks. With a thick back beat and a striking urban groove, the song radiates. TolumiDE sings of her love of God with reminders of what He does for her every day. Easily radio ready for urban or contemporary gospel stations, this song is a scorcher.

Another funky cut is the slick "What I'd Like". TolumiDE has a way of taking a concept and wrapping her emotive vocals around a percussive masterpiece. The song's lyrics find the singer desiring to be more like the Lord. "Because You Know" flaunts its strong African influence with a message of unity. Living in peace and harmony is the focus of this laid-back cut.

# ALBUM REVIEW

TolumiDE seems to shine with almost any musical platform she chooses. "Specialty" has a soulful and R&B theme, but with a relaxing and smoothed out delivery. With a dose of positivity, the song is one of pure jubilation. It's another fabulous track from the pen of TolumiDE herself.

Although many tracks lend themselves to upbeat and swiftly moving tempos, the artist knows how to slow things down with some beautiful melodic musical presentations. "Colours of Life", with a melancholy theme, but a hopeful end, showcases TolumiDE's gift of setting an introspective poem to music.

Single women will be able to relate to the familiar scenario TolumiDE spells out in "For Me". Over a mellow neo-soul groove, she sings about waiting on the right one and resisting the temptation to "help God out". There is much wisdom in the song, one definitely sung from experience.

"More Than You'll Ever Know" is another winner on My Love. A relaxed track about true love, it's one of the CD's most memorable tracks. From the viewpoint of a woman in love, the song speaks about a God-ordained love over rhythmic and captivating hook.

Jazz lovers will enjoy the contemporary yet traditional stylings of "Speed of Life". The song is a reminder not to take life for granted. "O Lagbara" is a festive track celebrating TolumiDE's African heritage. Translated "Jesu Christi Lagbara" means Jesus has a lot of power and strength. There's no doubt that this one is a praise tune with dancing not an option!




